<b>Cambridgeshire County Council</b>	<b>Changing Futures Programme</b> This provides a contribution to a countywide approach to supporting vulnerable people with multiple needs.	<b>£20,000</b>
<b>Peterborough City Council</b>	<b>Believe in Change Co-ordinator</b> This is a contribution to the commissioned service provision with Change, Grow, Live which delivers drugs and alcohol treatment and prevention. It specifically funds a post to work with people with high needs.	<b>£36,547</b>
<b>Cambridgeshire County Council</b>	<b>Drugs and Alcohol Treatment and Prevention</b> This is a contribution to Cambridgeshire's pooled budget to fund drugs and alcohol treatment and prevention. The contract is held by Change, Grow, Live.	<b>£94,000</b>
