SVD-006	Power the Fight via East Cambs District Council & Cambridgeshire County Council	County Youth Worker Conference Funding for a specialist provider to deliver an interactive workshop which supports awareness for those working with young people and strategies for engaging with young people impacted by serious violence. The youth work will be delivered to a younger cohort of people who are engaging in risky behaviours in areas in Cambridge/South Cambridgeshire that have been identified as hotspots for youth-related violence and/or anti-social behaviour. The project also involves targeted outreach with a small cohort of year 5/6 pupils on a one-to-one basis.	£35,587.50
SVD-009	Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service	Targeted Firebreak programme Firebreak is an intensive five-day scheme that enables students to develop key life skills through participating in a range of practical and scenario-based training exercises linked to firefighting. The Fire Service will work with partners to identify cohorts of young people who are vulnerable to serious violence and deliver targeted Firebreak programmes to them. The classroom-based elements will encourage discussion on knife crime, drugs, and serious violence.	£9,000

SVD-027	Via Cambridgeshire Constabulary	Serious Violence Conference – One Year On event Conference with local partners and stakeholders to share progress made over the last year in relation to the Serious Violence Duty.	£862.63
SVD-036	Via the OPCC	Respect Young People Programme (RYPP) The Respect Young People Programme (RYPP) is an early intervention programme that helps to prevent serious violence now and in the future. The YMCA receive referrals directly from the Constabulary, Early Help or the IDVA service for young people who are displaying violent or abusive behaviours towards their parents/carers and where there has been police involvement. The full RYPP programme encourages everyone to take a role in stopping the abuse and learning respectful ways of managing conflict, difficulty, and intimacy. Sessions include work on understanding behaviours and drivers, anger and conflict management and understanding emotions and behaviours. The triaging work draws on these principles and provides advice and guidance to prevent future violence within the family.	£11,999.20
