Service Description

Increased visibility: Additional staffing to carry out dedicated patrols in the named hotspot areas. A dedicated Inspector to manage and oversee the delivery of the project.

Analytical capability: Software and an analyst to support and increase the Constabulary’s analytical capabilities in relation to anti-social behaviour.

Training: Continuous professional development to officers to enable them to identify and respond to Anti-Social Behaviour and Serious Violence while on patrol

Youth work: A dedicated youth worker integrated into the Neighbourhood Policing Team to ensure that young people identified through patrols and problem-solving work are swiftly referred into the most relevant prevention and diversionary activity or pathway.

Youth diversion work: Targeted youth diversion based on evidence of initiatives that have worked well, linking with Serious Violence Duty funding.

Targeted enforcement: High visibility patrols in the nighttime economy and targeted enforcement against known premises and individuals.

Target hardening: Funding to enable target hardening measures such as CCTV, gates and removal of graffiti following visual audits carried out by Crime Reduction Officers.

CCTV: Airtime for re-deployable CCTV cameras.
