Phoenix Youth Provision	Pro-active work during the summer holidays with children and young people in Whittlesey who are, or are at risk of becoming, involved in criminal or anti-social activities.	£5,000
Youths of Fenland	Running costs for two youth groups based in Wisbech. The groups will offer some targeted work with individuals that are at risk of being involved in criminal and risk-taking behaviour.	£5,000
GLL The Hive	Providing up to 50, three month funded Junior Leisure Memberships across Cambridgeshire to children and young people aged 11–16 who are identified as at risk of disengagement or becoming involved in anti-social behaviour.	£3,525
Huntingdonshire District Council	Sports sessions over the summer holidays for young people in Huntingdon and St Neots to prevent ASB and people becoming involved in Child Criminal Exploitation.	£2,000
Stretham Youth Centre	Detached youth work, regular weekly sessions and funding towards a residential for young people in Stretham and the surrounding area, to engage with young people and educate them around making informed choices as well as showing young people in a positive light to the local community.	£3,900
Shrievalty Trust – Bobby Scheme	Video doorbells and subscriptions for households who are being affected by ASB from neighbour disputes.	£5,000
Fusion Family and Youth Projects	A three-day residential experience for 14 young people aged 12–15 from Huntingdon at high risk of becoming involved in anti-social or criminal activities.	£4,530

Fenland Youth Work Network	Six-week course at Thomas Clarkson Academy to raise awareness around Child Sexual Exploitation and Child Criminal Exploitation prevention. Also some funding for activities for individual young people and activities for during school holidays.	£5,000
Dhiverse	Delivery of Sex the Law, Internet and Pornography (SLIP) programme to 15 - 20 young people who have engaged or are at risk of engaging in concerning sexual behaviours.	£4,950
Huntingdonshire District Council	CCTV to be installed at Petersfield Villas in Huntingdon where there are known issues of ASB, drug dealing and child criminal exploitation.	£2,100
The Port Youth Group	Bikes and equipment that can be loaned to young people to use at the local facilities in Littleport.	£3,691
Turtle Dove	Facilitator training for professionals supporting children and young people to enable them to deliver the “Escape the Trap” programme across Cambridge — an early intervention to prevent domestic abuse and Violence Against Women and Girls.	£5,000
Romsey Mill	Facilitator training and delivery of a ten-week group in Trumpington to provide a safe and supportive space where young girls can be educated about the signs, risks and solutions of violence against women and girls.	£4,980.91
Cambridgeshire County Council	Resources to support the delivery of hate crime awareness training in schools in East Cambridgeshire.	£820
Cambridgeshire County Council	Training for youth workers to enable them to be able to better support neuro diverse young people in digital spaces, which they are drawn to as safe spaces, to ensure they are aware of the risks of online exploitation.	£3,000
