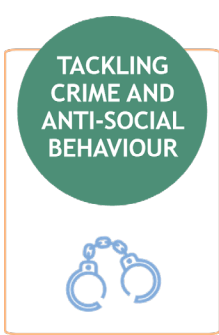

Cambridge Women's Aid	<b>The Empowerment Collective:</b> Funding contribution to the Co-ordinator of the Empowerment Collective, which is a community of local people dedicated to raising awareness about domestic abuse and the devastating impact it has.	£5,000
Cambridgeshire Fire & Rescue Service	<b>Targeted Firebreak:</b> Delivery of the Firebreak programme to cohorts of young people who are vulnerable to serious violence. The targeted sessions included discussions on knife crime, drugs, and serious violence.	£9,000
