


**CAMBRIDGESHIRE AND PETERBOROUGH POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER

<p>Subject</p>	<p>Supporting and working with families experiencing Child/Adolescent to Parent Violence and Abuse (CAPVA)</p> <p>Award of contract to YMCA Trinity Group</p>
<p>Decision</p>	<p>To formally sign the contract to award YMCA Trinity Group a 2+1+1 contract to provide support to, and work with families experiencing Child/Adolescent to Parent Violence and Abuse. The funding was agreed at Commissioning and Grants on 14 August 2023.</p>
<p>Decision Summary</p>	<p>A fair and transparent tender process has been run by 7F Commercial Services, supported by the OPCC, to award a contract to deliver support to families experiencing CAPVA.</p> <p>The support includes an initial assessment of needs and delivery of the Respect Young People Programme (“RYPP”). This programme is recognised by the Youth Justice Board Effective Practice Unit as delivering a sustained reduction in violence, improved communication and improved family relationships.</p> <p>A mini needs assessment looking at the prevalence of CAPVA in 2020 highlighted a costly cycle of repeated police attendance and a lack of local support/interventions. A successful bid by the OPCC into the Home Office Domestic Abuse Perpetrator Fund enabled the county to pilot the RYPP. It led to significant savings in police time and resources. Evaluation of the first cohort of young people who completed the RYPP revealed an 89 per cent reduction in police demand based on Athena Records, and 100 per cent reduction in missing from home reports one year after they completed the programme.</p>

	<p>The second cohort of 14 young people saw a 94 per cent reduction in police demand on Athena reports.</p> <p>The Police and Crime Commissioner agreed to provide ongoing funding for this work from the Crime and Disorder Reduction Fund – this is currently awarded through a Grant Agreement.</p> <p>This contract starts on 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2026 with the option to extend for a further two years.</p> <p>The contract value for 2024/25 is £194,436 and 2025/26 is £205,536.</p>
Recommendation	Recommendation for the Commissioner is to award the contract.
