Local policing bodies are the grant holders for Serious Violence Duty funding. Though local policing bodies themselves are not subject to the main Duty, they have specific functions granted to them by the legislation that permits them to issue funding to the specified authorities, support the specified authorities in the exercise of their functions relating to the Duty (such as by arranging meetings), monitor activity by specified authorities in relation to their delivery function under the Duty, and report their findings to the Secretary of State. Through these functions the local policing body is expected to perform a central convening role for their area, administer funding for the Duty to the specified authorities and monitor progress.
