## Ministry of Justice Rape and Sexual Abuse Support Fund (RASAF) Awards 2024-25

### Income

#### Ministry of Justice/Home Office Rape and Sexual Abuse Support Fund - £304,018.17

Cambridgeshire is one of five areas taking part in a local commissioning test where the combined Rape and Sexual Abuse Support Fund is awarded to the PCC. This funding is then allocated according to local commissioning plans. In Cambridgeshire this forms part of the budget to deliver the countywide support service for victims and survivors of rape and sexual violence.
