I am writing in reply to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, dated 26 March 2015.

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 (The Act) requires us to handle all requests in a manner that is blind to the identity of the requestor. Any information released in response to a request is regarded as being published, and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

#### **You requested the following:**

'I require a copy of the Risk Assessment for the van being parked on the grass verge, a copy of the camera operators training and the documentation for the last two years maintenance and breakdown records for the camera being used in the van on the 24<sup>th</sup> February 2016.'

#### **Our response to your request is as follows:**

This is an operational matter and I can therefore advise that the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner does not hold the information requested. However, Cambridgeshire Constabulary, which is a separate organisation and is treated as such under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, may hold this information.
