Dear Member of the Public

I am writing in reply to your request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, dated 17 May 2016.

The Freedom of Information Act 2000 (The Act) requires us to handle all requests in a manner that is blind to the identity of the requestor. Any information released in response to a request is regarded as being published, and therefore in the public domain without caveat.

You requested the following:

On 1/4/13, I was the victim of a serious assault in Cambridge, in which I was repeatedly stabbed by an assailant who was never traced.

I am requesting access, under the freedom of information act, to all information relating to the investigation that followed. Please send me all information I am entitled to, including but not limited to:

- The man-hours that were dedicated to the investigation
- The total amount of money spent on the investigation
- Which leads were followed up
- Information on any appeals for information that were made – to the media, the local public or local businesses in the area
- The number of witnesses who were questioned
- The reason the investigation was discontinued

- Theories the police may have held as to the motive

In short I would like as detailed account of the investigation as you are able to give.

Our response to your request is as follows:

I can advise that the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner does not hold the information requested.

However, Cambridgeshire Constabulary, which is a separate organisation and is treated as such under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, may hold this information.
