

**Huntingdonshire and Peterborough Councillor Round Table  
Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July 2022 via Microsoft Teams**

Police and Crime Commissioner, Darryl Preston held a virtual Round Table for Huntingdonshire and Peterborough councillors on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> July.

This was Darryl's third round of regular meetings with Councillors and provided an opportunity for local issues to be discussed.

Darryl began by welcoming those Councillors attending and updated attendees on progress against his Police and Crime Plan 2021-24 (published in November 2021). He also spoke about officer numbers and the recruitment process and reminded people about the importance of reporting.

**Other issues raised by Councillors included:**

- ASB in Peterborough – Darryl asked Councillors to send an email and he would prioritise and potentially visit.
- The top 3 priorities – and what Darryl is taking forward in (today's) Countywide Community Safety Strategic Board mtg – high harm issues
- Crime stats – whether the ONS data includes cybercrime
- Speedwatch volunteers – question regarding how the Specialist Policing Unit deal with the weekly reports we send them from our two MVAS devices.
- Officer recruitment – how are the Constabulary reaching out to potential applicants from diverse and disabled backgrounds

**The Commissioner agreed to the following actions:**

- Put Bretton Councillors in touch with the Bretton NHP team and forward invite to Parish Council Meeting.
- Share Community Payback contact details.
- Encourage all local parishes to consider working with Community Payback team to improve local environments.
- Open invitation for cllrs to invite Darryl in to their neighbourhoods (diary permitting)
