Putting communities first

Community Safety Partnership	Project	Amount awarded
Peterborough	Purchase of mobile cameras which can be used to tackle fly tipping at known hot spots in urban areas across Peterborough including Central, Park and North Ward.	£5,000
Cambridge City	Printing of CamCycle leaflets to be shared with students as a preventative measure to try and reduce cycle crime within the city at a time when there are many students coming to the city for the first time.	£500
Fenland	Tackling fly tipping in the New Drove area of Wisbech by clearing the area and putting in place physical measures to make it more difficult for people to fly tip there in future. Printing of leaflets to be distributed in the local area and putting up signs to deter people from doing this in future.	£1,450
Cambridge City	Joint funding with the local authority to purchase cycle marking kits to reduce and help to tackle cycle crime in the city.	£3,000
Peterborough	Funding for Taxi Marshalls to work in the city centre during peak evenings over the Christmas and New Year period to help to ensure the safety and wellbeing of the public.	£2,000

South Cambs	Two bike repair sessions, and purchase of lights to give out to those in attendance as young people have been riding bikes without lights. Targeted at young people, and those on low income via housing associations, warm hubs and food hubs.	£1,037.40
Cambridge City	Purchase and installation of two CCTV cameras in Rose Crescent and Market Passage, which are areas of high crime and ASB.	£3,800
Cambridge City	Funding for Taxi Marshalls for two nights a week between January – March 2023 in Cambridge City Centre as a trial to see if the existing scheme, which ensures the safety of people in Cambridge at night, should run all year round.	£5,000
