| Youth Act Up                         | Funding enabled Youth Act UP in Little Downham to put on a production, the group focuses on supporting young people to develop in all areas, such as, wellbeing, health, confidence, relationship building, teamwork, resilience, personal development and a sense of community.                    | £3,500         | July 2022    |
| LEADA                                | LEADA deliver workshops to secondary schools and year six pupils supporting them to explore issues that will help to build their resilience and help to prevent them becoming involved in County Lines.   | £3,400         | July 2022    |
| Revamp the Ramp                      | Funding was awarded towards a large-scale project to refurbish the skate ramps in St Neots Riverside Park.  | £3,500         | July 2022    |
| Huntingdon Community Action Projects | The funding awarded enabled families, who have earned time credits through volunteering in the local area, to access activities on a residential trip which they would not otherwise have been able to. | East Cambs Community Safety Partnership | A court trial experience for secondary school pupils across East Cambs was funded.
